



QUALIFICATION TOURNAMENTS





The qualification process for the FIVB World Cup 2011 involved all five continents with the winners of the five continental championships and the best four out of the five runners-up joining hosts Japan and two wildcard selections for the men's and women's competitions respetively.

With the FIVB World Rankings from January 15, 2011 used as the determinant to see which teams would qualify for the World Cup as the four best runners-up, all eyes were focused on who would reach the finals of the respective continental championships and consequently go on to win the gold and silver medals.

In the women's qualifiers, Kenya (23) became the first team to join World Cup hosts Japan after they saw off Algeria (15) in front of their home fans in the African Championship.

USA (2) and Dominican Republic (13) then put their names into the hat following the conclusion of the NORCECA Championship. The United States sealed the title with a straight sets win over the Caribbean side but with both teams above Algeria in the world rankings, their progress was guaranteed after they successfully navigated their way through the semifinals.

China (6) became the third team to book their ticket after they saw off fierce rivals Japan (3) in the Asian Championship. With Japan already guaranteed a place as hosts, Korea (18) had a chance of qualifying as the next best team, although they had a nervous wait as they held the lowest rank among the other runners-up at the time, with Algeria now assured of a place. With Serbia (9) beating Germany (10) in the European final it was left for Argentina's (25) loss to Brazil (1) in the South American final to confirm Korea's progress.

In the men's qualification tournaments, Iran (19), China (11) and Egypt (13) were the last three teams to qualify with the final of the Asian Championship and the African Nations Championship taking place at the same time.

Egypt saw off Cameroon (17) to book a spot however Cameroon still had a chance of qualifying as one of the four best runners-up, needing a Chinese win to guarantee them a spot. But it wasn't to be as Iran (19) sealed a first ever AVC title thanks to an impressive victory over China in front of their home fans to send them marching onto Japan with Cameroon narrowly missing out as they sat six places below China in the world rankings.

Cuba (4) were the first men's team to join Japan (14) at the World Cup after they held off a stubborn USA (5) in a thrilling NORCECA Championship. However USA were never in any danger of not making the tournament with their strong world ranking, ahead of every African and Asian team, thus guaranteeing them a berth. Focus then turned to Europe as Serbia (3) sealed a come-from-behind victory over Italy (6) to clinch their first ever European Championship. But Italy qualified in similar fashion to USA as their position in the standings meant they also earned a ticket to Japan. Brazil (1) picked up gold at the South American Championship to become the next side to directly qualify for the World Cup as they saw off long-time rivals Argentina (8), who eventually qualified as the third best of the four runners-up.

Once the nine teams were determined to join Japan, two wild cards per gender — Italy and Argentina for women, Poland and Russia for men — were selected by the FIVB in collaboration with the Japan Volleyball Association and host broadcaster Fuji TV.



Earlier in the day, China and Argentina got off to excellent starts in Hiroshima, winning their clashes with Algeria, who were making their first appearance at the World Cup, and the Dominican Republic in superb style.

China saw off Algeria in straight sets in a match which saw the three time champions completely dominant. Having won the World Cup in 2003, China didn't participate in 2007 due to the fact they had already qualified as host of the 2008 Olympic games. They started this qualifying event for the 2012 Olympic Games in fine form.

World No. 20 Argentina pulled off a remarkable come-from-behind victory 3-1 against the Dominican Republic, ranked 14th in the world. The Dominicans, who had seen libero Brenda Castillo sent home for disciplinary reasons, started strongly taking the opening set but a resilient Argentina came back to claim their second successive victory in FIVB competition against the Central Americans in the first World Cup match to feature three female referees in FIVB history.

"I think Simona Gioli has won [the blocking battle]," Italy coach Massimo Barbolini said. "Rivera was good in the World Grand Prix, and it was difficult to block her but I think our block won today. In general we played well, and had a good match with the block." Argentina and Algeria clashed for the first time in a FIVB competition with the South American Championship silver medallists clinching the honours 3-1. For Argentina, ranked 20th in the world, and Algeria, 17th, there was plenty at stake and it was Argentina who took the crucial maximum three points on offer while winless Algeria had the consolation of claiming their first set.

In the last match of the day in Hiroshima, Japan went close to breaking their losing run against neighbours China — which saw them lose in four sets at the 2011 Asia Championship final and in last year's World Championship – but they eventually went down in a five set thriller 3-2.











Italy had a fairly balanced attack on the day as Simona Gioli collected 14 points while the tournament's leading scorer after the first round Carolina del Pilar Costagrande and 17-year-old Caterina Bosetti, playing her first full game for the national team with older sister Lucia, posted 10 apiece. For Argentina, who had never beaten Italy in four previous

A tournament high 29 points from De La Cruz couldn't stop the Dominican Republic going down to three-time champions China 3-1. Coming off an emotional high from a five-set thriller against rivals Japan, China started slowly for the third time in four matches by conceding the first set against a side they had only lost once to in 14 previous encounters, but eventually went on to win with Hui Ruoqi, and Yang Junjing and Wang Yimei sharing the scoring.

In the final match of the day, Japan moved up to sixth on seven points with a 2-2 win-loss record following a straight sets win over Algeria, repeating their World Championship result last year while Algeria equalled the lowest score of the tournament registered by Korea against USA a day earlier.

Defending champions Italy stood alone on top of the FIVB World Cup standings with 14 points as the only unbeaten team after collecting their fifth win, beating Algeria in straight sets. Coach Massimo Barbolini took the opportunity to give his entire team a run. With stars like captain Eleonora Lo Bianco and Simon Gioli resting on the bench, world No. 7 Italy were led by Sara Anzanello up front with 16 points. "We are very happy we finished this second round undefeated," Barbolini said. "In this match I could see my players who don't usually play at all; they deserved this chance. Now I think we have to concentrate on the third round. It is sure to be very, very hard. I think that every match will be very difficult moving forward.

Three-time champions China collected their fourth win from five matches after beating Argentina 3-0. The world No. 6, who won the World Cup in 1981, 1985 and 2003, hadn't been at their most dominant over the opening two rounds but proved they were still a force to be reckoned with.

Hosts Japan were firing on all cylinders against a young Dominican Republic team winning 3-0 to the delight of the home fans.





Finally Iran marked their return to the World Cup after a 20 year absence with victory over hosts Japan in four sets.

A raucous crowd cheered on the home side but Arash Kamalvand led Iran in the victory, with Alireza Nadi and Mehdi Bazargarde playing strong supporting roles.





Cuba brought Iran back down to earth after their dream start by registering a straight sets win on the second day of first-round action in Nagoya. Fernando Hernandez was the driving force for the Cubans, powering spikes around the court and unleashing several deadly serves. He had a match-high 20 points and was named the most impressive player in the win. Young captain Wilfredo Leon played a strong supporting role for Cuba, chipping in 18. Alireza Nadi totaled 12 points for Iran and Mehdi Bazargarde added 11 to the count of the Asian champions.

Poland downed Serbia in four sets in the second match of the day with Zbigniew Bartman and Michal Kubiak spearheading a balanced attack from the world No.4 in a hard-fought match that featured both great individual and team play.

Argentina held off Japan in a five-set epic to round out the second day of action. Facundo Conte and Luciano De Cecco played key roles for Argentina in the victory. De Cecco was named the most impressive player of the match. On the other side of the net Tatsuya Fukuzawa and Kunihiro Shimizu were the most influential players for Japan.




"We had a good game today, and we're happy to take three points with the win here," Russia captain Taras Khtey said. "Right now even a single point is meaningful in this tournament."

Italy and Argentina faced off, with the former walking away the victors 3-1. The match saw Italy again involved in an epic first set, having set the World Cup record for the longest set earlier in the tournament against the US. This time it didn't quite reach the same dizzying heights, but was still just as tense as they edged ahead 36-34.

Brazil came into Tuesday's match against Serbia with a 5-2 win-loss record having been handed their second loss to a young Cuba team. The South American's were again stunned with another defeat at the hands of a spirited Serbian squad who clinched the 3-1 victory.

















HIROSHIMA Hiroshima Sun Plaza

Hiroshima Sun Plaza is a world-class multipurpose hall built in 1985. The international "Peace City" of Hiroshima has produced many famous volleyball players, such as Katsutoshi Nekoda who won gold with the Japan men's team at the Munich Olympics in 1972. Hiroshima will be hosting the World Cup for the ninth time. Capacity: 5,000



NAGANO

Nagano Prefecture is known for its mountains — many higher than 2,500m — and is nicknamed "the Roof of Japan." White Ring was used for figure skating and shorttrack speedskating at the 1998 Winter Olympics, and has hosted the FIVB World Cup twice before (1999 and 2003), as well as the FIVB World Championships (2006). Capacity: 8,000



TOYAMA

Toyama City Gymnasium

Nagano White Ring

Toyama City Gymnasium has a strong relationship with the World Cup, having hosted World Cup games in 2003 and 2007. Built in 2002, the gymnasium is just a five-minute walk from Toyama Station, ensuring that plenty of volleyball enthusiasts from central Japan and elsewhere will have the opportunity to visit Toyama. Capacity: 5,000



SAPPORO

Hokkaido Prefectural Sports Centre

Hokkaido Prefectural Sports centre is located in Toyohira-ku, Sapporo, and will host the World cup for the sixth time this year, including the women's tournament for a fourth time. Sapporo is the capital city of Hokkaido and the fifth biggest city in Japan. Capacity: 8,000



OKAYAMA

Momotaro Arena

Momotaro Arena is located in the coastal region of Okayama on the south coast of Honshu, the main island of Japan. It has previously hosted a number of national volleyball events including a group in the 2010 World Grand Prix Preliminary Round. Capacity: 7,000



TOKYO

Tokyo Metropolitan Stadium

Tokyo Metropolitan Gymnasium is the "B" venue for the fourth round of women's matches and was used in the 1964 Olympics. It was completely rebuilt in the early 1990s under the supervision of architect Fumihiko Maki, who gave the building its futuristic design. It is the venue for a number of major sporting events. Capacity: 5,000



TOKYO

Yoyogi National Stadium

Built to house the swimming competitions at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics, the spectacular Yoyogi Gymnasium features a unique, high-tension suspension roof. It has held many volleyball competitions, including the 2010 Women's World Championship final and is designated as one of the 100 architectural landmarks of Tokyo.

Capacity: 12,000



NAGOYA

Nippon Gaishi Hall

Nagoya, with a population of over 2 million, is the core city of Japan's central region and has flourished since the edo era (1603-1868). It is a sister city to Los Angeles and Sydney. Nippon Gaishi Hall is best known as the site of the annual Nagoya Grand Sumo Tournament and is easily accessible from Nagoya Station.

Capacity: 10,000



KAGOSHIMA

Kagoshima Arena

Kagoshima Arena is based in the south-western city of the same name, which is on the island of Kyushu. The Arena was opened in 1992 and has a rich World Cup tradition having hosted the tournament three times previously in 1995, 1999 and 2003. Capacity: 5,000



OSAKA

Osaka Municipal Central Gymnasium

Built with "harmony with nature" as its concept, Osaka Municipal Central Gymnasium resembles two green hills as a result of the trees that are planted on its roof. It is one of the world's very few multipurpose facilities that is built completely underground and serves as Osaka city's main entertainment venue.

Capacity: 8,200



KUMAMOTO

Kumamoto Prefectural Gymnasium

As a main sports facility of Kumamoto, Kumamoto Prefectural Gymnasium has hosted various international sports events. It is a well-equipped sports complex with variou sized gymnasiums, a meeting room, a gymnasium for children, an indoor swimming pool and a training room where everyone can easily enjoy fitness and sports. Capacity: 5,000



FUKUOKA

Marine Messe Fukuoka

Fukuoka's geographical advantage as the closest Japanese port to the Korean peninsula and China has enabled it to fl ourish as a centre for international exchange. Marine Messe Fukuoka is located in the port of Hakata just 2km from the business centre. The venue is host to a range of events, from sports to exhibitions. Capacity: 15,000



HAMAMATSU

Hamamatsu Arena

Hamamatsu Arena in Shizuoka prefecture opened in 1990 and is widely used as a venue for sporting events and music concerts, and is equipped with a high standard of acoustic and lighting facilities. Hamamatsu Arena is home to the Hamamatsu Higashi Mikawa Phoenix professional basketball team.

Capacity: 5,000


